

What to Bring

- Campers should bring a **Lunch** and **Snack** with them every day. Campers will not have access to a refrigerator or microwave. We will take two breaks each day to rest and eat - once for lunch and once for a snack. ***Please Note: CFRT maintains a NUT FREE camp environment. Please do not pack food items containing nuts.***
- A **Water Bottle**. No water fountains will be accessible. If the camper's bottle runs empty, CFRT will provide a disposable bottle of water.
- A **Pencil**
- A **Highlighter**

What to Wear

- **Closed Toe Shoes** - No Sandals or Flip Flops
- **Comfortable Clothing** to move in – No skirts or dresses unless you are wearing leggings or shorts underneath.

What NOT to Bring

- **Electronic Devices** – CFRT has adopted a Screen Free experience.
- **Money**

Regarding Covid-19

The health and safety of our campers, volunteers, and staff is a top priority and we take creating a clean and safe environment very seriously. CFRT leadership is staying up to date on the recent developments by monitoring the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) and the North Carolina Department of Health and Human Services (NCDHSS).

Based on guidance from these institutions, the following protocols and requirements are currently in place at CFRT.

- Number of campers in each group is limited to a max of 50% room capacity.
- Each camp group will have a separate entrance.
- CFRT will scan all campers and staff with a no-contact infrared thermometer at check-in each day. In the case of a higher-than-normal temperature (100.4° or higher per CDC guidelines), CFRT will ask the camper or staff to return home for a 24-hour period or until symptom free.
- If a temperature is detected and the camper is a member of a carpool, all members of the carpool will be asked to return home for a 24-hour period or until symptom free.
- Upon entering the building, all campers and staff will be required to sanitize their hands. Hand sanitizer stations have been installed around the building and will be present at each entrance.
- Campers and staff will stay with their group and in their designated areas including classroom and bathroom space throughout the day to limit person-to-person contact.
- Campers and Staff are required to wear a mask or face shield at all times. CFRT will provide a face shields to all campers. These shields are also designed to be a part of the campers' costumes and will be provided in lieu of a camp t-shirt. These shields will remain on site to be sanitized daily and then can be taken home after the final performance.

- Each camper will be provided with a personal cubby space to hold their items between check in and check out.
- All arts and craft supplies (when applicable) will be pre-sorted and distributed in lieu of communal buckets.
- While on site, all campers and staff will practice and enforce 6' social distancing to the best of our abilities.
- CFRT will clean and sanitize each room overnight as well as sanitizing high touch areas like bathrooms and doorknobs 3x during the span of a camp day.
- If a camper becomes ill during the hours of camp, an emergency contact will be notified and the camper will be required to leave the facility for a minimum of 24 hours or symptom free.
- If an instructor or camper is suspected to have contracted COVID-19, all members of their group will be notified, and the remainder of the camp session for that group will be moved to a virtual learning environment until it is safe to return.
- You will need to fill out our waiver before the first day of camp.

Special Needs

If there are any special accommodations that you feel we need to be aware of regarding your camper (medications, allergies, behavioral concerns, illnesses, etc.), please contact our education staff as soon as possible.
